It contains left-over material from the production of Wahrheit ist Arbeit [Truth is Work] and on the left-hand pages it shows aphorisms coauthored by Werner Büttner, Martin Kippenberger and Albert Oehlen, juxtaposed on the right-hand pages with reproductions of works by the authors and other artists, including Alexander Calder, Peter Fischli/ David Weiss, Raoul Hausmann and Jörg Immendorff." "This catalogue was published to accompany a group exhibition of four artist friends: Werner Büttner, Martin (here: "Mattin") Kippenberger, Albert Oehlen and Markus Oehlen. The straight-forward, reduced concept is striking. Each artist was allocated one chapter, introduced by a portrait, and showing reproductions of paintings with captions. All the illustrations are set at the upper edge of the type area, in keeping with the cover layout. There are no commentaries, biographies or exhibition lists." Koch 2002


"In 1976 Kippenberger's mother was killed in a car crash..... She bequeathed about 750,000 DM to him. With the money he inherited, Kippenberger moved from Hamburg to Berlin in 1978. To celebrate his 25th birthday on 25 February 1978 he had posters printed showing him with a tramp, and entitled '1/4 Jahrhundert Kippenberger als einer von Euch, unter Euch, mit Euch... [1/4 Century Kippenberger as one of you, among you, with you...]. He also published the book Vom Eindruck zum Ausdruck. 1/4 Jahrhundert Kippen-berger [From Impression to Expression. 1/4 Century Kippenberger] featuring a set of photographs from Kippenberger's family album for purchasers to stick in themselves.* The poster and publication mark the beginning of an extensive self-projection, all the more inclusive for the fact that Kippenberger's inheritance gave him the financial means to do so". "The artist book with 114 uncommentated reproductions of portraits of women (some with the author) is not typical of the Berlin-based Merve Verlag publishing programme, which normally focuses on theoretical texts. There is no text whatsoever. In order to reduce the number of words on the cover, Kippenberger even dropped his own first name. At the request of the author, the otherwise obligatory brief biographical outline of the author and the list of available publications on the inside covers were also replaced by pictures. Kippenberger left it to the printer to decide the order of illustrations." Koch 2002

The works of the "seven" artists are divided into five chapters: pages 5-23: drawings over black and white photographs by Markus Oehlen; pages 25-37: a 12-part series of images by Ina Barfuß: pages 39-93: co-authored works by Werner Büttner, Georg Herold and Albert Oehlen from the period 1979-1981; pages 95-107: 11 collages by Thomas Wachweger; pages 109-127: paintings, collages and photographs by Martin Kippenberger. "Promptly on his 30th birthday Martin Kippenberger made his Abschied vom Jugenbonus [Farewell from Youth Bonusl. The cover of this anniversary volume shows a charming photo of the only son of the Kippenberger household as a youth, glancing over his shoulder on the driveway, with his four sisters in the background. The inside, by contrast, seems at first sight to be ruthlessly violent portrayal of the sexual obtrusiveness of the normal. Coldly and unfeelinaly, illustrations from nudist magazines were disassembled and cut up, indifferently formless and unwieldy, as if the artist's treatment was completely disconnected from the photos themselves, the whole thing printed in bluish-purple half-shadow." 

There is no list of the now 30 to 50 strong impressionist community. Although new individuals are inducted, the communication is so vaque that it will never be possible to ascertain all the so-called 'members' of this 'Lodge'. There is no paper, no leader, no regular meeting place."* Between 1990 and 1996, 15 issues of the leaflet were published at irregular intervals.
